### The Next Fifty Years for Harrisonburg Rockingham Child Day Care Center

We have dreamed of having our own space, designed specifically for infants, toddlers, preschoolers and school-age children. In 2010 we began our building fund with proceeds from our wildly successful Dancing With the Stars of the 'Burg fundraiser. As of November 2019, we have raised nearly \$1 million and have purchased a property in downtown Harrisonburg, fulfilling our strong desire to remain in the heart of downtown. Our goal is to celebrate our 50th anniversary in 2021 with a ribbon cutting to herald operating from our own space. We must turbo-charge our fundraising efforts.



Designing and building our own facility will allow us to provide the best environment for children's development and learning which positively impacts school and life success. Owning our building allows us to maximize our resources, utilizing square footage to maintain the most effective teacher/child ratios and group sizes.

Harrisonburg Rockingham Child Day Care Center has been continuously serving the community since 1971 and is a registered 501(c)3 non-profit agency. The center is governed by a volunteer board of directors. At HRCDDC, every dollar donated works hard, stays local, and impacts young lives positively for the future. ### Our New Center

Our new building will serve up to 175 children.

First floor includes reception area, administrative offices, 3 infant rooms, 2 toddler classrooms, 2 preschool classrooms and a comfort room for parents. The infant and toddler outdoor play space will be on the ground level, in front of the building entrance.

2nd floor includes three preschool classrooms, 2 pre-K classrooms, library, a teacher work/meeting room and laundry.

3rd floor offers a school-age classroom, community space for indoor play and meals, a conference room and industrial kitchen.

4th floor features a fenced roof-top playground with climbing equipment, bike path for bikes and trikes, "houses" for storage and creative play.

### Building for the Future

Our capital campaign goal is to raise funds to design and build a sustainable, innovative, child-centered facility. The space will intentionally serve to support teachers and staff in delivering the highest quality programs. To serve both the child care center and the community, the building will be equipped with a commercial kitchen and common area that could be used by civic groups or downtown activities.
